UNRAVELING THE LANDSCAPE

The ground beneath our feet is only the topmost layer of a complex pattern of rock types and geological structures. By delving deep into its past, we can understand the history of a typical modern landscape.

15. LIMESTONE RIDGE. A block of limestone is pitted with holes, through which water sinks underground.

 LIMESTONE CAVES. Water running through layers in the rock erodes caves and channels. 17. CHAIN DOWNLAND, THE off. permeable beds of chain one rise to rounded, well-drained stills

18. SANDSTONE RIDGE. The massive buildup of denorm send has now been compacted into relatively hard sandstone. 19. DEEP COAL MINE. Where coal seams lie well below the surface, shafts are driven down to extract the mineral.


20. STRIP COAL MINE. Coal near or at the surface can most easily be mined in a series of strips.

21. SALIT DOME OIL TRAP.

Buoyant salt pushing up from below distorts the surroundings, trapping oil in reservoir rocks.

22. ANTICLINE OIL TRAP. A simple upfold in sedimentary layers provides a cap under which oil is trapped.







U.S. News and World Report (August 18, 1997) The only models that have been shown to explain the Ice Age are those that consider the impact of the Genesis Flood. It would be impossible for another lce Age to occur today, since the Arctic Ocean is cold with very little moisture in the air.




Numerical simulations of precipitation in the polar regions using conventional climate models with warm sea surface temperatures have demonstrated that ice sheets thousands of feet thick could have accumulated in less than 500 years.



Mankind was not restricted to stone tools for very long, since archaeological evidence has shown that metal-working had begun within a few generations after the Flood.




The most common method of migration was on foot, while a few crossed the seas in search of new land to settle.



Erosion on the floor of the English Channel is revealing the remains of a busy Stone Age settlement from a time when Europe and Britain were still linked by land, a team of archaeologists says.

The site, just off the Isle of Wight, dates back 8,000 years, not long before melting glaciers filled in the Channel and likely drove the settlement's last occupants north to higher ground.



Oldest Skeleton in Americas Found in Underwater Cave?

Deep inside an underwater cave in Mexico, archaeologists may have discovered the oldest human skeleton ever found in the Americas.

Dubbed Eva de Naharon, or Eve of Naharon, the female skeleton has been dated at 13,600 years old. If that age is accurate, the skeleton—along with three others found in underwater caves along the Caribbean coast of the Yucatán Peninsula—could provide new clues to how the Americas were first populated.



The remains have been excavated over the past four years near the town of Tulum, about 80 miles southwest of Cancún, by a team of scientists led by Arturo González, director of the Desert Museum in Saltillo, Mexico (see map of Mexico).

"We don't now how [the people whose remains were found in the caves] arrived and whether they came from the Atlantic, the jungle, or inside the continent," González said.

"But we believe these finds are the oldest yet to be found in the Americas and may influence our theories of how the first people arrived."
