

WATER

It is estimated that our bodies are made up of about 60% water. The water in our bodies is constantly being used up and evaporated. It is absolutely necessary to replenish it daily. It is said that we cannot live more than 3 days without supplying our cells with new water.

In John Chapter 4, Jesus travels through Samaria. He stops to rest at Jacob's well. It seems obvious he is thirsty and hungry. His Disciples left him there and went to town to buy some food.

Meanwhile a Samaritan woman comes to draw water and Jesus asks her to give him some to drink. She responds with surprise that He, being a Jew, would speak to her a woman of Samaria.

“Jesus answered and said unto her, If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water.”
- John 4:10

At first, it seems she doesn't understand that Jesus is speaking spiritually instead of physically.

Then, *“Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life.”*
- John 4:13-14

WOW! Wouldn't that be nice? To never get thirsty again? The woman thought so too.

So, *“The woman saith unto him, Sir, give me this water, that I thirst not, neither come hither to draw.”* - John 4:15

That is when Jesus reveals he is speaking of Spiritual matters instead of physical ones.

So, the woman tries to debate with Jesus. Don't try to debate with Jesus about the Bible. You will never win.

“The woman saith unto him, I know

that Messias cometh, which is called Christ: when he is come, he will tell us all things. Jesus saith unto her, I that speak unto thee am he.” - John 4:25-26

Jesus just revealed himself to her as the Messiah!

SURPRISED, she runs off to go to town. (Leaving her water-pot).

She came that morning to get water, because she was thirsty. Notice: Nowhere does it say she ever got any water. In fact, the word water-pot, seems to indicate an empty vessel. If it had water in it, the text would have said she left her water.

About that time, the Disciples come back from town. Now, the disciples could be considered the greatest Christian Theologians of their day. They wrote the New Testament and experienced Jesus' ministry first hand. But, with all their knowledge, they didn't bring anyone from the town to Jesus.

Yet when the Samaritan woman went to town, she just told what happened

to her.

“Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did: is not this the Christ?” John 4:29

Then she brought a multitude of people back to Jesus and started a two day revival.

So, what happened to her anyway?

Jesus revealed to her that he was the Messiah. She believed on him and was saved. She went to the well that day physically thirsty. Even though she didn't get any water to drink for her body, her soul was satisfied.

You don't have to stay Thirsty. Jesus may have been speaking specifically to that Samaritan woman that day, but that life giving water is available to you too.

“...And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely.” - Revelation 22:17

This is in stark contrast to the rich man in Hell.

“And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.” - Luke 16:24

If you have never been born again, you need to be saved. You must turn from sin and turn toward God. (Repent) And put all your faith in Jesus to save you from the hell you deserve as a sinner.

Do that and he promises to give you that life giving water. You never have to thirst again!

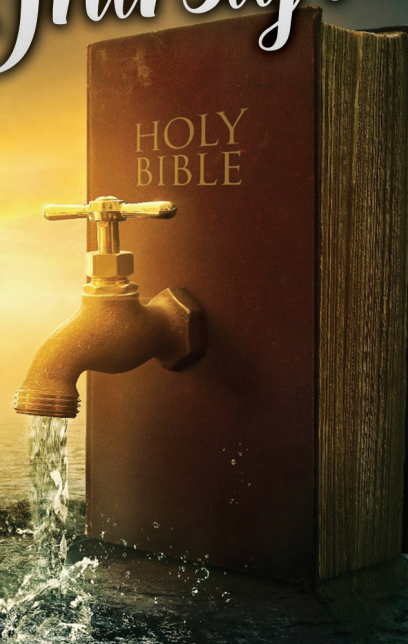
